JAMES M. J.-Born Nov. 19, 1911, Los Angeles, Calif.

Here we have a youngster with Saturn rising in Taurus, opposition to the Moon. An afflicted Saturn is cruel, relentless, and obstructive. Taurus is fixed and stubborn, determined to have its own way; Scorpio is also unfeeling and without sympathy, and the Moon takes on the nature of the sign it is in. So if there were no other influences to be considered, we would have to judge that James is extremely selfish, cruel, and unsympathetic. But Venus, the planet of love, is in good aspect to Mercury, the planet of mind. This at once takes the edge off the indication of cruelty, and the spiritual influence of the Sun conjunction Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, cannot be underestimated as a factor in mellowing the nature. Thus, by synthesizing the auguries, we come to the conclusion that James is going to be very strong-willed, and determined to have his own way, but although he may at times, under adverse planetary conditions, seem cruel and unsympathetic, there is nevertheless a noble and kindly side to his nature. This side should be fostered by the parents to the utmost of their ability.

Scorpio, the great healing sign, being so strongly fortified by the presence of the Sun, Moon, and Jupiter, shows that James will make an excellent surgeon, and that is a vocation where there is more scope for kindness and cruelty than in any other profession. By vivisection and experimental operation a surgeon may cause unspeakable misery to his fellowmen and animals. He may also earn the everlasting gratitude of sufferers by constructive surgery. If the parents can sup-

press the cruel side of James' nature and foster the kindly side, they may make him a great benefactor to the world and make it possible for him to attain a most wonderful soulgrowth. They have a great opportunity, and a great responsibility. May God help them to bring out the best in their child.

Should it appear, however, that he does not soften as readily as hoped for, beware of letting him go into the medical profession, for when he sees blood it will harden his nature further. God has provided another way for him which will automatically soften the nature. We find Venus, the planet of art and music, in her own sign, Libra, which expresses the beautiful and noble. She is well aspected by Mercury, the planet of mind, and Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, showing that James has musical ability. The Sun and Jupiter are also in good aspect to Neptune and Uranus from the seventh house, which indicates the public. Neptune gives an unusual touch to the musical temperament, which makes those who have it different from the general run of musicians. This is perhaps the safest road for James, or it may be that with music as a safeguard he will be all right as a healer. That will be for the parents to judge, but they should not by any means neglect cultivation of the musical talent even if it is decided to let him pursue the medical profession.

Saturn in Taurus will make James frugal in his food; the Moon in Scorpio will make elimination of waste almost too free, and as the Sun, the giver of life, is conjoined with the expansive Jupiter, we may judge that James will have a very long life and good health. Saturn in Taurus gives him a tendency to cold in the throat, and Mars in Gemini shows

that it may settle in the apex of the lungs. Look out for him in those respects, and should the tonsils swell, use massage; once he is past the fifteenth year, that trouble will disappear.

With respect to the financial prospects we find that James will be well taken care of, for the Sun is conjoined with Jupiter, the planet of opulence, and anyone with Saturn on the ASC is bound to be thrifty. If he spends his money, he is going to get full value. Mercury, the ruler of the second house in good aspect to Venus, the planet of art, shows that he may become a collector of art and use considerable money to gratify that desire. This will be good as it brings out the best side of his nature.

STEPHANA ENDORA H. — Born January 14, 1913, 6:25 a.m., Denver, Colorado.

Capricorn was rising at the time of Endora's birth, and that is not usually very propitious as it favors gloom and timidity. In this case, however, we find that Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, which is exalted in Capricorn, is right on the ASC, in conjunction with Mercury, the planet of reason, and Jupiter, the jovial planet always ready with a hearty hand-shake and a beaming smile. This makes Endora different, particularly as all these planets are sextile to Venus, the planet of love. The Sun is also in the first house to brighten the temperament and disposition. This will give Endora a very happy childhood, but she will have to hew her own road to success in life. Of course, she will be the better for it, as it will give her more strength and self-reliance

wherewith to overcome the underlying Capricornian timidity.

The Sun signifies the Spirit, the individual Self, and it is trine to Saturn, the planet of persistence, showing that no matter what obstacles may be placed in her way, she will in a quiet, persistent manner achieve her own ends in the course of time. Mercury, the planet which governs the reasoning mind, being in conjunction with Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, and Jupiter, the plant of benevolence, shows that she has a keen, noble mind, extremely alert, both to the practical, artistic, and idealistic sides of life. The practical side comes from Mars, the love of beauty from Venus, and the elevated ideals and general success in life are shown by the conjunction of Mercury with Jupiter.

Venus, the planet of love and attraction, is in the second house in Pisces, her exaltation sign, where she is particularly strong, and her sextile to the three above named planets, particularly her configuration with Jupiter, the planet of opulence, shows that Endora will have an affluence with which she will be very generous. The trine of the Sun to Saturn, the planet of tact and diplomacy, in the fifth house, the house of speculation, shows also that she will be thrifty and will be capable of making shrewd investments to make what she has earn a still further increment.

We know that every rose has its thorn, however, and that nothing in life is perfect as yet. Therefore it is not surprising to find that there is also another side to Endora's mind and disposition, and the lessons she has to learn are shown by the Moon in Aries, square to Mercury, the planet of mind, from the third house. This house signifies the mentality and also travel. The Moon shows the instinctual mind and it is

strengthened by being in Aries, the part of the zodiac which governs the head and brain. From this configuration we learn, in the first place, that it will be best for Endora not to travel, as change will always bring her loss and trouble. That is not the worst, though. It gives her a superficiality, so that at times she will want to flit from subject to subject, taking up this, that, and the other study or work, and finishing nothing — when transits or progressed positions of the planets bring this configuration into activity. If this habit is allowed to grow, it will interfere seriously with her work, and her memory will also be affected. It should, therefore, be the aim of the parents to look out for and discourage this tendency, while fostering the other good sides of the mentality of the child.

Besides the splendid mental qualities which are shown in this horoscope, you will also find that Endora will develop a surprising dexterity. She will be able to turn her hand to anything, and the way she will make work fly with little or no seeming effort will be amazing to all who see it.

Among other things, too, you will find that the exaltation position of Venus in Pisces with the configuration to Mercury, Mars, and Jupiter, will make her quite an able musician with an uncommon spirit in the rendition of the themes she chooses.

There is one field of life, however, where her path will be the very reverse of smooth: courtship. Saturn, the planet of obstruction, in the fifth house, which governs the attraction of the sexes, always makes matters very difficult, if it does not entirely forbid them. In this case though, we find that Saturn is trine to the Sun, which is the significator of

marriage for a woman. Therefore, we may judge that Endora will by patience and persistence finally find the craved companionship — and she will crave it. There is in her a very strong love nature, shown by the sextile of Venus to Mars, Mercury, and Jupiter. Therefore the denial of this relationship would be to her a loss of all that is worth while in life. However, no matter how good the aspect of Saturn is to any planet except Mercury or possibly the Moon, where it steadies and deepens the mind, there is always some little hitch in the benefit received. It is the nature of Saturn to restrain, and in a case like this where he is configurated with the Sun in a woman's horoscope, we may judge that however kind and good the husband may be, he tends to act as a damper upon her in a certain sense, especially as the Sun is in the saturnine sign Capricorn. You will find that the women born between December 21st and January 21st, when the Sun is in Capricorn, usually marry men who hold a heavy restraining hand over them, especially if the Sun is adversely configurated with Saturn by conjunction, square, or opposition. Even the trine, as here in Endora's horoscope, will make itself felt to some extent. Usually it is most difficult to escape from the things signified by Saturn, but there may be an escape for Endora from this condition if you instill into her from babyhood the idea that we are all Spirits and equal in the scheme of evolution, so that no matter if for the present life one is manifesting in a male or a female body, everyone has the same fundamental rights and prerogatives; no one is entitled by marriage or any other relationship to dominate anyone else. Teach her that it is the duty of everyone to guard his or her own individual rights

and refuse to submit to undue influence or authority, because now it is our task to evolve individuality, and habits of selfabasement are subversive of attainment of that end.

Endora's general health will be good except at such times when the erratic streak spoken of comes to the surface and makes her restless. Then the Moon square to Mercury, which has rule over the nervous system, is apt to cause a temporary general state of nervousness. The position of the Sun and Neptune affecting the region of Cancer, which governs the stomach, shows also that at such times an attack of nervous indigestion may manifest itself. In this case, however, there is little wrong with the body. What you will have to work with is the mental condition, for that will be the cause of any passing disturbance to the health.

JOHN ALLEN HEINE—Born August 4, 1913, 2:30 a.m. New York City.

The first thought that strikes us on seeing this horoscope is a doubt if John will live, for Cancer, a sign of slight vitality, is rising, with its ruler, the Moon, squared by Saturn, the destroyer. Doubt is soon dispelled though, by the observation that Saturn receives the sextile of the life-giving Sun, and the Moon is well aspected with Jupiter, the planet of vital magnetism. These aspects give John sufficient life force to carry him through. At the same time, it is evident that he requires more than ordinary care, and as the affliction of Saturn comes from Gemini, which rules the lungs, he should be specially guarded against cold for it is apt to settle

in the chest. If it is possible to migrate to a less rigorous climate, it would undoubtedly be well to do so. Breathing exercises and gymnastics rationally practiced during childhood will strengthen the chest and give him resistance in later life. If right methods are followed John will be as strong as any ordinary boy.

When we investigate John from the standpoint of mentality, we meet with a very different person; there he is almost a giant. Mars, the energizer, in the mercurial sign Gemini, trine to Uranus, the planet of intuition, in the intellectual sign Aquarius, shows that John has an energetic, quick mind which grasps things instantly the moment they are presented. Saturn, the planet of obstruction, in Mercury's sign Gemini and sextile to that planet, gives depth to the mind and the ability to reason correctly. The Moon, signifying the instinctual mind, is also in a mercurial sign, Virgo, trine to Jupiter, the philosophic planet, adding its testimony to the excellency of John's mental capacity. John will have some very advanced ideas on social and economic problems, which will bring him into a public work of a benevolent nature. He will be successful in that work. This is shown by Jupiter, ruler of the sixth and tenth houses (which signify the nature of the service one renders in the world and the social standing), trine the Moon, ruler of the second house, which shows the financial reward of service. Saturn, the planet of deceit, in the twelfth house, the house of sorrow and secret enemies, square the Moon, shows that he will not escape the usual fate of all who endeavor to work for the uplift of their fellowmen. He will be slandered and traduced, but as Christ said: "Blessed are ye when men shall accuse

you falsely for my sake."

There is only one thing about this horoscope which we regret: Venus, the planet of love in its ordinary human application, is unaspected in the twelfth house. meet sincere regard from all who come in contact with him in his work, but few, if any, will reach into his life and love John for himself; he will be a recluse and a lonely soul. At least, such is the tendency, and the mother should endeavor to supply the want of love if possible. Every human being craves in its innermost heart that deepest of all sympathy, and no matter how well we may have fixed our hearts in God, we feel poor without that human touch. Christ Jesus felt sadder in Gethsemane because His disciples could sleep while He was in such anguish, and everyone who has been through the smaller gardens of aloneness knows what that means. If he will let you be his companion on those occasions, you will both be blessed.

JANET BARBARA H. — Born January 1, 1904, 11:50 a.m., Leicester, England.

At Janet's birth we find the martial sign Aries rising and the three other cardinal signs are on the other angles, showing that she has an abundance of energy and that the life will be a very active one. The planets in her horoscope are scattered all over the figure, so that she will be versatile and able to take care of herself under any and all circumstances. If she does not succeed in one thing she will take up something else and never become discourageed.

The Sun is at the zenith point, to endow her with vitality

and give her good cheer throughout life. The Moon, which is the particular significator of health for a woman, is trine to Mars, the reservoir of dynamic energy, and Saturn, the great obstructor, is unaspected, so that there is every prospect of a long life in good health before Janet. However, Saturn always does some damage to the part of the body where he is located, or its opposite point, and as he is in Aquarius, we may therefore judge that in the latter part of life he will obstruct the circulation in the ankles and slightly check the heart. Seeing that he is unaspected, however, the effect will probably be very slight, so that it may scarcely even be felt.

With respect to the mental capacities, we note that Venus is sextile to Mercury and Moon; Mercury and Venus are parallel so that she will be of a kindly and sympathetic disposition. Because of Moon trine Mars, she will always seek the friendship and companionship of man in preference to woman, and she will benefit by them, for Mars is in the eleventh house signifying friends. This configuration also gives her a good income, but she will be rather prodigal with it and therefore liable to financial ups and downs.

The Sun near the Midheaven in the cardinal sign Capricorn shows that Janet will rise in life by the help of people in a higher social position, and she will probably obtain employment in connection with the government.

We find Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, in Pisces, the twelfth house sign, intercepted in the twelfth house and square the Moon. This gives us the key to Janet's principal fault and the trouble it will give her in life unless it is overcome. Being so extremely efficient herself, she will find it hard to allow for the deficiencies of others, and this lack of

tolerance will make enemies for her. Though they will not be able to hurt her permanently, we cannot escape the fact that we always suffer ourselves in some way when we hurt others. If you will impress upon her the necessity of being tactful and tolerant of other people's feelings there is no question that it will help her considerably in life.

According to the horoscope, there is no tendency to indiscretion in her association with young men whom, as said, she will seek in preference to young women, and we do not think that ever the breath of slander will come near her. Nevertheless, Mercury and Venus are in Scorpio, the sign which rules the generative organs, showing that sex will play some part in the attraction, and it would, therefore, be well to show her the womanly woman as an ideal so that by a correct manner and conduct she will be her own protection.

Uranus, the planet of intuition, and the Moon, the symbol of the dreamer, are in Gemini and Sagittarius, the signs signifying mind. This shows that Janet will be intuitive and may probably seek to delve into the occult, but as the Sun is in opposition to Neptune, the latter in the psychic sign Cancer, she ought especially to beware of ever becoming entangled with spirit controls. However, upon second thought, we believe that Janet will be quite safe in this respect, on account of her otherwise positive nature. But forewarned is forearmed, and should ever the occasion arise, it will be best for her not to have anything to do with spiritualistic phenomena, for that is playing with fire.

VICTOR, L. S. — Born Sept. 17, 1913, 12:14 p.m., Los Angeles, California.

At the time of Victor's birth the aspirational sign, Sagittarius, was rising, with Jupiter, its ruler and the planet of opulence, in the first house. This is a very fortunate position so far as health and vitality are concerned, for the opulence which expresses itself in financial fortune to the favorites of Jupiter is also operative in giving health and strength when it comes from the angle which determines these factors in life. As wealth can never compensate for health, one on whom Jupiter bestows the latter is surely much more to be congratulated than when it merely takes the form of material means, which is often a source of evil in other directions. Therefore, we may say that Victor drew a good prize in this life when he was born with a fundamentally healthly constitution. Saturn, the obstructor, is in Gemini, the sign which rules the lungs, but he is sextile to both Venus and the Moon. This should offset his square to the Sun and give Victor a life of general good health, and when sickness does come at rare intervals he should be able to throw off the effects and recuperate easily.

With respect to the disposition, a number of conflicting influences are noted. Venus, the planet of love, is trine to the Moon, which is the significator of the instinctual mind, showing an underlying kindly disposition. But we find Saturn, the planet of obstruction, square to the Sun, which is the giver of life, light, and joy. This shows gloom and the gloom is deepened by the fact that the Sun is in conjunction with the saturnine Dragon's Tail, and with Mercury (combust), the significator of the concrete mind. We also find that this configuration takes place in the ninth house, ruling the higher mind. Thus we have before us an Ego that tends to wrap itself in a garment of gloom and draw apart from its fellows, an exceedingly unfortunate tendency, for

by the process of brooding over their troubles, whether they are real or fancied, these people build around them a shell which is really and truly like a cage in which the Spirit is imprisoned. Furthermore, such people are exceedingly difficult to help, for they resent any effort to get them out of their shell as an insult or an injury, and regard those who want to befriend them as their worst enemies.

Fortunately, though you have come to us at a very early age of your child. The invisible vehicles are still in the making, so we hope and pray that you may be able to save this Ego from such a terrible fate. In the first place, no matter what he does, be sure that you do not scold him, for he will be exceedingly sensitive to harsh treatment and take the slightest words very much to heart. Do everything you can to make his childhood cheerful, and particularly see that he spends as much time as possible out of doors with the birds and the flowers. The trine of the Moon to Venus, the planet of art and beauty, will give him a keen sense of enjoyment in that direction, and we hope it will keep the door to his heart open so that the sunshine of life will dispel the gloom of Saturn.

Another configuration which we find bearing upon Victor's mental condition is Neptune sextile to the Sun and Mercury. Mercury, the planet of reason, is, as said, afflicted by its conjunction to the saturnine Dragon's Tail and is also combust, too closely under the Sun's rays, a position that burns up the qualities of the planet so placed. Therefore, we may judge that Victor will not be a good reasoner but will have something better to guide him. Neptune is the higher octave of Mercury, and the sextile mentioned will give him the solution to his problems without the necessity of reasoning them out beforehand, but after he has arrived at a conclusion he will be able to give a reason why that is the best way out in a given situation. That is the difference between the actions of Uranus and Neptune. Both

planets enable us under certain configurations to solve our problems without the process of reasoning. When we arrive at a result through the medium of Uranus, we know only that so-and-so is the best solution, or that so-and-so is a fact; we cannot tell why. If the Neptunian ray is used to solve our difficulties, we know both the answers to our problems and the reason, without having recourse to the faculty of logic.

In his dealings with others, the sextile of Saturn, the planet of tact and diplomacy, to the Moon, will give Victor these qualities so that he will not act on impulse, but always deliberately and with forethought.

When we look for his faults in order to help him by suppressing them before they have a chance to make themselves manifest, we find that Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, is square Mercury, the planet of reason. This shows that there will be an abundance of mental activity. He will conceive thousands of schemes and will make resolutions, but will lack the patience and persistence to carry them out. If this tendency is allowed to manifest and mature, it is going to be the worst drawback to his success in life; you must therefore endeavor to help him to develop constancy of purpose. Saturn, the planet of persistence, sextile to the Moon, helps to minimize the tendency, but it will nevertheless require considerable work on your part to impress upon him from the earliest childhood that whatever he starts he must carry out to the end. Do not let him start to build a house with blocks and tear it down before it is half finished to make a gate, leave that partly done and go on to doing something else, but coax him, help him, prod him, do whatever you can to get him to finish the the house first—and use a similar method in all other respects. DORIS A. — Born March 26, 1915, 4 a.m., Texas.

At Doris' birth, four common signs were on the angles, and the Moon, which is the planet of dreams, was in conjunction with Neptune on the cusp between the psychic sign Cancer and Leo. This will give Doris a tendency to dream her life away. She will want to live in a beautiful fairyland of sublime visions, but will not be inclined to exert herself so that her dreams may come true. She is going to have an easy life for there is not a single unfavorable aspect in the figure. It is from such aspects that we get the shocks and jolts which cause us to exert ourselves and climb the pathway of life. Therefore, in kindness to her you must supply the missing incentive so that she will have to do her share of the world's work in looking after herself, and after others as well; the only real happiness comes by feeling that you have some mission and are filling a place in the family or community.

The Sun is strong in his exaltation sign Aries on the second cusp, where he has rule over the finances. He is trine to the Moon, which is placed in Leo in his own sign. This shows that Doris will always have plenty of the world's goods to do with, which gives her an added responsibility,

for in the final analysis we are only stewards of that which we possess. Unless we put it to good use we shall sometimes have to give an account for our misconduct of the affairs entrusted to us. Therefore Doris' education ought to include the right use of money, how to distinguish between thrift and meanness, generosity and lavishness, discrimination in giving, etc. She will be so placed in life that she will have the opportunity to give to others, but no matter how generous she may be, unless she learns to give herself with her gifts it will have no value from the spiritual point of view. This will require an expenditure of energy which she may not like to make unless her early training develops a sense of duty which will impel her from within to overcome the tendency to self-indulgence shown by the horoscope.

Doris' mental qualities are good, for Mars, planet of dymanic energy, and Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, are in conjunction with Mercury, planet of the concrete mind. Mercury rises before the Sun, which along with the trine configuration of the Sun with the Moon, shows an un-commonly bright mind. Moreover, Saturn is in the mercurial sign Gemini and thereby strengthens the power of concentration so that Doris is going to make herself felt in whatever circle she is placed in life. Everyone instinctively recognizes and bows to a superior mentality, especially when it is not domineering but kindly and considerate, as indicated by Jupiter conjunction Mercury. Venus, the planet of love, in the humane sign Aquarius and in the twelfth house which denotes prisons and hospitals, gives us the impression that she may eventually takes up some work in connection with institutions of that class. At any rate, whatsoever work she may do in the world will have some connection with charity.

With respect to the health, we find that Doris has an excellent constitution. Jupiter, Mercury, and Mars on the Ascendant, as also the placement of the Sun in its exaltation sign Aries in the first house, in trine to the Moon, which rules the female functions, are all evidences of a splendid constitution, which will stand all the ravages of time. Should at any period of life passing planetary conditions cause illness, it will be short, and she will recuperate so quickly that it will surprise all.

The weakest point in the chart is shown by Saturn in Gemini, which rules the lungs, but even there a trine to Venus protects her. So, taken in its entirety, this is an extremely good horoscope, save for the fact that it shows none of the troubles which we need to make life really worth while from the spiritual point of view. We therefore trust that Doris will find in other people's lives the sorrows that will awaken in her the needed sympathy.

LINZEE G. — Born April 1, 1911, 11 a.m., Hyannis, Massachusetts.

At the time of Linzee's birth the weak sign Cancer was rising, with Neptune there square to Mercury. If this were the only testimony concerning her constitution, it would show a very low vitality, but the Sun, which is the giver of life, and Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, were both elevated at the time of Linzee's birth, and in good aspect. Both of these planets are strong vital energizers and their position

and aspect will do much to counteract the other influences and strengthen the brain and constitution.

While we are upon the subject of health, we may also note that Saturn is singularly free from bad aspects in this horoscope, so that in this way there is also an indirect strengthening of the nature. However, it is a rule, which we have never known to fail, that even apart from bad aspects the place where Saturn is found in the horoscope is always a weak point and apt to bring suffering. We may, therefore, judge that the presence of Saturn in Taurus, the sign which rules the throat, shows a liability to cold in that part of the body, and probably a swelling of the glands which may sometimes obstruct the passages. Do not, however, wrap her up in order to save her from colds, but instead, try to inure her to cold and strengthen the throat so that she may become immune.

The Moon and Venus are placed in Taurus in opposition to Jupiter in Scorpio, the sign which governs the generative organs. As the Moon rules the tides in the universe, so does it rule the fluids of the body and particularly the periodical flow at the monthly periods, and this opposition will have a tendency to make the menstrual flow exceedingly copious. It will, therefore, be particularly wise to instruct this child concerning the changes which take place at puberty, so that she may not be unduly frightened and will know how to care for herself when that time comes.

With respect to the mind, we find that Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is in conjunction with the Moon, signifying the instinctual mind. This gives equipoise and the ability to concentrate. It may, therefore, be called a very fortunate configuration with respect to the mental qualities, but Mercury, the planet of reason, is square to Uranus, the planet of intuition. This position also gives mental activity, but makes the person who has it apt to jump at the wrong conclusion and to become critical, sarcastic, skeptical, and impulsive in speech. Naturally a person of such a turn of mind is not a favorite among her associates, and if that phase of her character is allowed to develop, it will bring her trouble with friends and relatives, make her exceedingly restless under all conditions, and anxious to seek new fields, no matter how well she may be off where she is. That is an extremely unfortunate trend, and you should do your best to counteract it by discouraging, under all conditions, criticism and sarcasm. Teach her that no matter where she goes there will always be troubles with someone, that nothing is perfect in this world, and therefore it will be better for her to try to fit into conditions where she is than to run from one place to another.

Mercury is also square to Neptune, its higher octave, and this position will tend to make her irresolute, vacillating, and dreamy; psychic phenomena will have an almost uncanny attraction for her. When anyone approaches the invisible world under such a configuration, he or she always comes into contact with the least desirable element there. Mediumship is an exceedingly dangerous matter, and you should never allow her to attend any place, meeting, or circle where there is the slightest chance that she may come in touch with those undesirable conditions.

The Sun is the general significator of the marriage partner for a woman, and the sextile between the Sun and Mars will make Linzee exceedingly attractive to the opposite sex; this constitutes a danger during courtship. We find also that Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, attraction, expansion, and joviality is in the fifth house, which governs courtship, in the sign Scorpio, which rules the generative organs, in adverse aspect with Mars, which signifies the suitors. This shows that no matter how good and pure her own thoughts and ideals may be, she will be extremely liable to insults. The Moon and Venus in opposition to Jupiter, together with Mercury square Neptune, shows that she is apt to be slandered whether or not she has done wrong. This is a very sad fate which has spoiled and embittered many a life, and the parents should therefore endeavor to teach Linzee from the earliest childhood days the virtue of circumspection and the avoidance of even the slightest appearance of evil.

Fortunately, as we have often said before, the horoscope shows only tendencies. The stars have no power to compel us to do anything contrary to our own will, and we may therefore alter our horoscope by sufficient will power. There is no configuration so evil that it may not be turned into a stepping stone to good, especially when the matter is taken in hand during the days of childhood, and we therefore trust that you may be able to guide your child clear of the rocks by knowing just where they are placed.

MARION S. — Born April 16, 1904, 11:30 a.m., Denver, Colorado.

At the time of Marion's birth, the celestial sign Leo was rising, and its ruler, the Sun, was at the same time near the zenith in its exaltation sign, Aries. This will give Marion an abundance of vitality, force, and strength, so that she will experience very little sickness in her life. When her health does fail under unfavorable planetary configurations it will only be for a short time and she will recuperate quickly. Saturn is square to Mercury from Taurus and Aquarius, both signs of voice. This shows that her throat will be one of the weakest points in her anatomy and that she will be liable to colds which will affect the voice. We also find that Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, is in conjunction with the Moon, which governs the female functions, and as this conjunction occurs in Taurus we may judge that there will be a reflex action felt in the opposite sign, Scorpio, which rules the genitals. We find Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, and Venus, the planet of love in the ninth house, which governs the higher mind. This shows that Marion's disposition is basically kind and good. However, Mars and the Moon in Taurus, a sign which governs the tongue, voice, and expression, shows that she has a way of expressing herself impulsively and bluntly, so that she is exceedingly apt to give offense to people without meaning to do so at all. This is a tendency which you should

by all means try to curb in her, for people naturally resent anything we may say when our manner is rough. We make enemies of them no matter how good our intentions were in the first place. It is always better to clothe one's words in a cloak of politeness and suavity, which will make friends for us, than to ride rough-shod over people and turn them into enemies. Seeing that this configuration occurs in a fixed sign, you will find it very difficult to change her and it will probably require hard knocks of life and experience. We also find that Saturn, the planet of diplomacy, is square to Mercury, the planet of mind and reason. There must always be a fear of detection and consequent disgrace, and then there is the penalty thereto that when people find a person to be a prevaricator, they never rely on his statement after that, taking everything else he says with a grain of salt.

Marion has a good mind and a quick wit, for the Sun and Moon are highly elevated and parallel, both of them in their exaltation signs, even the square of Mercury to Saturn deepens the mind and makes it more capable of concentration. Therefore, if you can reason these things out with her, we believe she will listen and take heed. Neptune is in the

psychic sign Cancer and placed in the twelfth house, which denotes mediumship. It is square to Venus in the ninth house which governs the higher mind. This shows that Marion is sensitive, but if you should allow her to come into a spiritualistic circle where there are invisible spirit-controls they would be very apt to seize upon her and force her into mediumship. You should, therefore, be very careful not to allow her to attend such seances or in other ways associate with people who have already attracted that kind of Spirits.

With regard to Marion's financial circumstances, you may feel easy, for the Sun, which rules the second house, is highly elevated, exalted, and parallel to the Moon, all signs which show comfortable circumstances. The Sun is trine to Uranus in the fifth house, which indicates, among other things, educational enterprises. Uranus is the planet of science. It is in the sign Sagittarius, which denotes religion, law or philosophy. The Sun signifies the government or employer in a high position. Therefore, we may judge that Marion will find her vocation in a government position connected with science and education, and she ought to shape her study with that end in view. This should be easy for her, for the Sun trine Uranus, the planet of intuition, will give her a quick solution to all her problems without the necessity of reasoning them out.

It is doubtful if Marion will want to marry, for Saturn is in the seventh house. If she does, it will be to a person much older than herself, and while it may advance her socially because the Sun is in the tenth house (the Sun is the general significator of marriage for a woman and the tenth house

signifies the social position), it will be best for her not to enter into such a union, which is sacrilege unless there is mutual love. Besides, as said, she will by her own efforts become very comfortably situated and be much happier without marriage.
